

In a first for Locksmithing in Australia and New Zealand, a definitive list of industry professionals is being compiled.

Why does the Locksmithing Industry need a Register?

- Different legislation across New Zealand, and Australian States and Territories has meant there is no single list of qualified locksmiths
- Privacy Acts have prevented even training institutes (TAFE or Competenz) from identifying their apprentices, or those who have completed Trade Certificates, Diplomas or Recognised Prior Learning
- Many locksmiths qualified under a "grandfather-clause" which recognised them before more formal qualifications became available or learned on-the-job
- Auto locksmiths have been left in 'limbo' and should be recognised

Have you completed a Certificate 3 in Locksmithing or are you an Apprentice completing your Qualifications? Have you received Recognition of Prior Learning through TAFE, completed a Trade Competency Test with a Locksmithing Association (MLAA, LGA, ANZLA, NZLA, MLA (UK), ALOA or other Association) or has the craft been handed down from generation to generation?
